When venturing out on foot, please exit the property via the pedestrian gate in the courtyard to avoid having to cross the cattle grid on foot. PLEASE LOCK THE GATE BEHIND YOU.

CAR PARKING

Please park where indicated on the right in the Farm courtyard. The gate to the Stables courtyard is immediately adjacent. If you have brought more than one car, please enquire as to where is best to park the second vehicle.

HEATING

The heaters are set to provide an ambient level of heating, but please feel free to adjust the thermostats up and down to suit your preference. Please see the separate page in the folder for operation instructions.

If you are out of the house for extended periods of time, we would be very grateful if you would adjust the temperature down until you return.

Mini Oven

The Mini Oven has three dials.

- The top dial sets the cooking temperature.
 - The middle dial sets the oven function.
 - The bottom dial sets the time of heating.
- It also doubles as an audible timer.

All three dials need to be set for the oven to operate.

Please remember:

- Always monitor the oven during use.
- Always use an oven glove.
- Take care not to pull the oven forwards.
- Don't remove the heatshield above the oven.
- Clean when cool with a damp sponge.
- The rotisserie option is not available on this model.

Induction Hob

To switch the hob on, press the power button and the zone display will light up.

Position the pan on the chosen cooking zone and adjust the power with the + and - buttons.

Press the B for the booster function that will work for 5 minutes at 2000w.

To activate the child lock, hold the key symbol for 3 seconds. Repeat to deactivate.

To activate the timer press the clock symbol and choose the length via the + and - symbols.
To deactivate, hold the clock symbol for 4 seconds.

Turn off using the power button once finished.

Please remember:

The surface of the hob will remain hot for some time after use.
Clean once cool with a damp sponge.

Heating

We have three very efficient electric heaters in the stables, which give off more than enough heat to keep you snug and warm on the coldest of days.

The two black heaters within the main part of the stable can be operated as follows:

To turn on the radiator, make sure the orange button on the side of the radiator is on. Press the  symbol, the upper part of the display will show the temperature.

To select modes press the  button. The 'half Sun' indicates it is in standby, and the 'full Sun' means it is in heating mode.

Press the temperature button  to increase the temperature from 5 - 40 degrees Celsius. Keep pressing the button, and to decrease, keep pressing the same button and it will return back to 5 degrees and you can set your desired temperature.

PLEASE ENSURE THESE RADIATORS ARE NOT COVERED IN ANY WAY TO AVOID FIRE AND OVERHEATING OF EQUIPMENT.

Bathroom Heating

There is a towel radiator in the bathroom which can be adjusted via the two circles on the display.

Simply press the left hand side to lower the temperature, and the right hand side to increase the temperature.

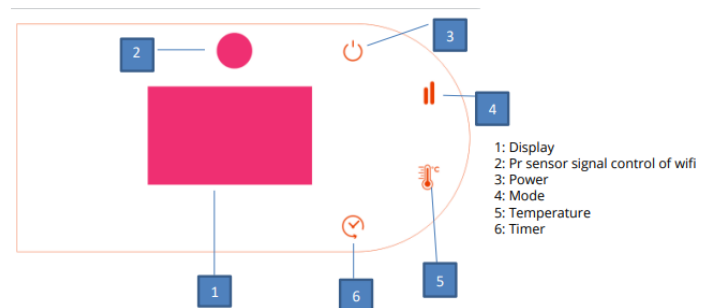
The towel rail does get hot - please be mindful of small hands.

TV – Quick Guide

Turn the TV on using the largest (TV) remote.

Press the home button on the small (Fire) remote.

If you can't access the firestick home page after doing the above, press 'source' on the large remote and select HDMI 1.

To access live TV, select the 'TV' button on the Fire remote. Select the channel you desire – this may take you to the channel via an app. For BBC channels, select the iplayer app.

To access Netflix, Amazon Prime or other apps, press the app button on the Fire remote or navigate to the apps from the home page.

Similarly, to access other apps and 'catch up' players, use the Fire remote and navigate from the home page.

Feel free to log in to your own accounts, but please also remember to log out at the end of your stay.

Please do not order any paid services (films, sports events, channels etc) charged to accounts that are not your own. You will be held liable for any additional charges incurred.



BBQ & Pizza Oven

We have a BBQ and a Pizza Oven available in the Stables courtyard for guests use. There are BBQ utensils and pizza oven equipment located in the box on the covered decking area.

Please feel free to use them as you wish. If you would need BBQ fuel, we have bags of instant lighting charcoal available to purchase. Please take a look in our mini shop in the stables courtyard garden.

We can also supply a bag of coffee logs and a bundle of kindling for the Pizza Oven, and even have pizza dough available to purchase. Please take a look in our mini shop for the fuel and message us for pizza dough.

Please clean the ovens and utensils after use and place the utensils back in the box when finished.

SAFETY ADVICE

Do not use the BBQ or Pizza oven indoors or in a confined area due to the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning.

Once you have finished cooking, extinguish the BBQ completely and allow the Pizza Oven to cool completely before handling or moving. Please dispose of your spent charcoal and ash carefully when cold in the bag provided, and leave outside on the courtyard stones.

Guest Bikes Available

We currently have four mountain bikes that guests are free to borrow. We also have helmets available if needed.

If you would like to borrow the bikes, please try to let us know at least the day prior so that there is plenty of time for us to reply with the access code for the storage and further details.

There are lots of wonderful cycle routes in the forest, make the most of exploring on two wheels!

If you do get a puncture, or notice any faults with the bikes, please do let us know so we can make sure it is repaired.

If a bike is damaged or stolen whilst in your care, an amount of up to £200 per bike will be paid in compensation to Belle Vue Farm.

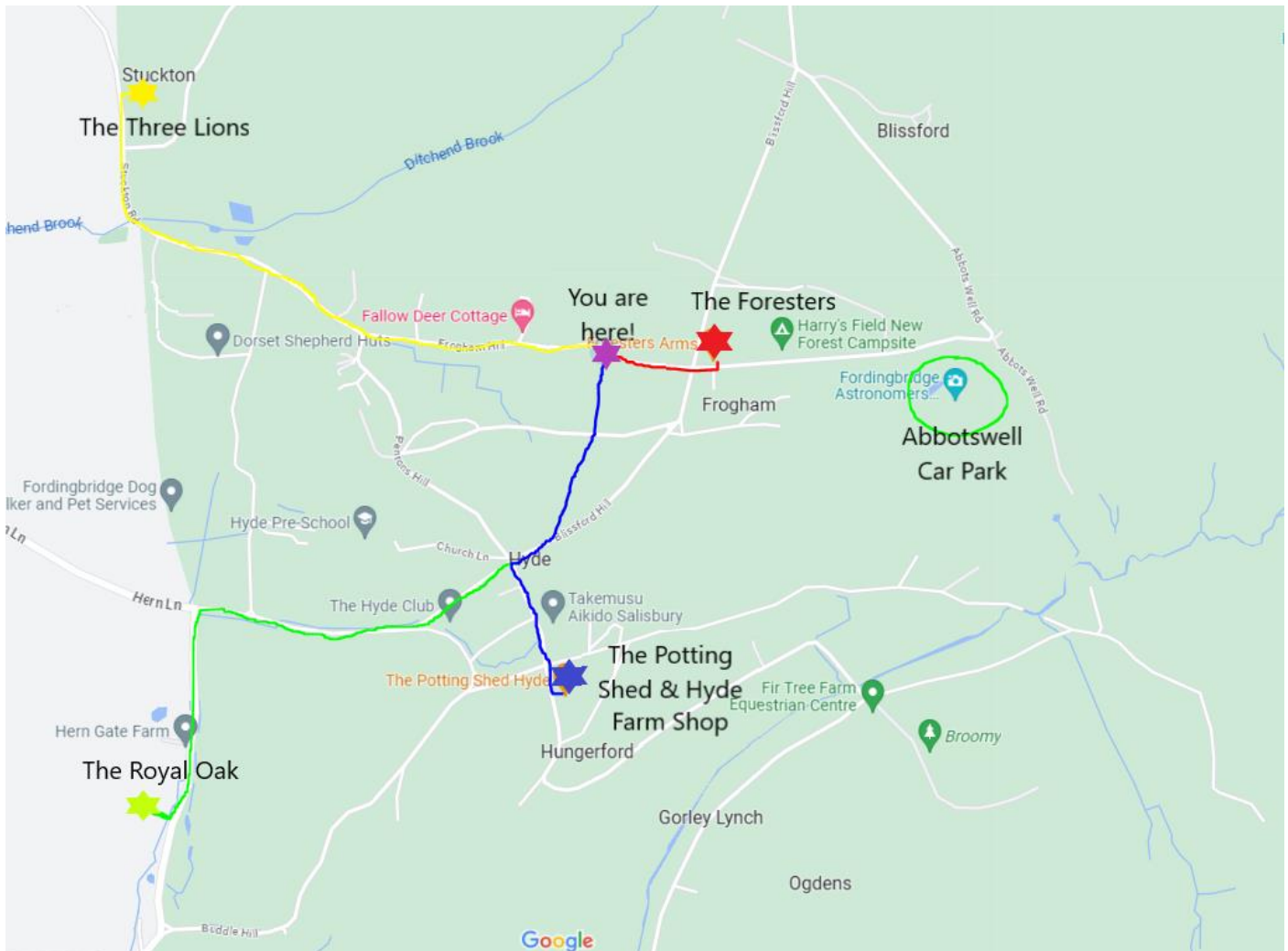

Explore on bike or foot...

There are an infinite number of trails in the forest! Turn left from the pedestrian gate in the Stable Courtyard and at the end of our footpath is the open forest!

A good spot where many trails begin is Abbotswell which is just a short walk away. We have left a few published walking/cycling guides inside your property, feel free to borrow them as you wish. The map below will help to guide you to some of the very local attractions within easy walking distance.



- The Foresters: Follow the red path.
- The Three Lions: Follow the yellow path.
- The Royal Oak: Follow the blue then green path.
- Open forest: Follow the blue path (our footpath) until you cross the stile.
- The Potting Shed Tea Rooms: Follow the blue path.
- Hyde Farm Shop: Follow the blue path.
- For Hockey's Farm Shop or The Alice Lisle, follow the directions to The Royal Oak and keep going!
- The Green circle shows Abbotswell Car Park which is a great free car park from which to explore a beautiful part of the forest on foot or bike. There is a great trail down to the Fritham Royal Oak from here.

Food & Drink: A few of our local favourites

FORESTERS ARMS 01425 652294

Abbotswell Road, Frogham SP6 2JA

Just a stones throw from the Stables is the 'Donkey Pub'. A stylishly eclectic New Forest Favourite. Serving plentiful pub food and pizzas in the summer, with plenty of outdoor seating. The perfect stop after a walk in the fresh air. They do a great Sunday Roast too.

THE THREE LIONS 01425 652489

Stuckton Road, SP6 2HF

Great food and stylishly decorated, this favourite has a large sunny patio that catches the evening rays, and a big garden for little ones to roam with BBQs and music on a Friday in the Summer. Serving a great menu with a South African twist, a friendly welcome and reliable service.

Just a short walk from here across the forest, the Potting Shed is an award winning tea rooms serving the best breakfast, lunch, coffee and cakes! We love the excellent quality of food, and the beautiful flower garden with tables for outdoor dining. Recently named amongst world's best by TripAdvisor. Definitely worth a visit!

THE ROYAL OAK 01425 652244

Ringwood Road, North Gorley SP6 2PB

A former Royal Hunting Lodge, it has a traditional feel and a beautiful beer garden. This 17th Century Inn serves excellent food (including wonderful roasts) with good service. It also boasts guest ales and has an extensive gin selection.

This lovely cafe is part of an award winning farm shop and is home to some friendly animals including alpacas and piggies! It serves tasty and local goodies from the shop on its menu and there is garden seating to enjoy.

Here are just some of our favourite places to go:

FORDINGBRIDGE HIGH STREET

Here you will find many independent gift and specialist shops including The Gourmet Grocers lovely grocer/deli. There is also a Co-op and a Tesco Express, pharmacy and several pubs, restaurants and cafes including The George, No 1 Shaftesbury Street and The Ship Inn. There is even a small art deco cinema. The closest petrol station is also based here.

RINGWOOD TOWN CENTRE

In the Furlong next to the main car park there is a lovely selection of shops including Joules, Crew Clothing, Fat Face, Phase Eight, The White Company, Waterstones, Boston Tea Party and Waitrose. In the wider town there are several lovely independent shops as well as Boots, Iceland, Sainsburys, Superdrug, Clarks, several banks and plenty of coffee shops, pubs and restaurants.

BURLEY

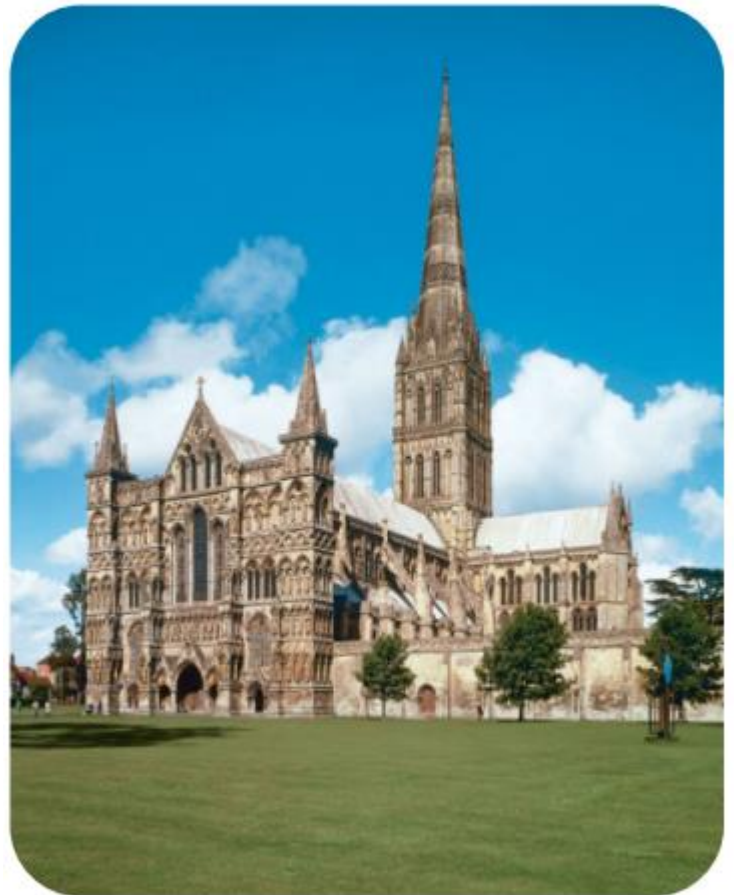

SALISBURY

LYMINGTON

This upmarket port town with boutiques and lots of lovely shops on a high street that leads down the waters edge. Where you can have a drink and ice cream and watch the boats. There are also plenty of pubs, cafes and tea rooms and a bustling Saturday market.

BOURNEMOUTH TOWN CENTRE

A stroll through the gardens to the pier is a very lovely thing to do in Bournemouth! The award winning sandy beaches are beautiful, and there is always plenty to see and do and some great lunch spots as well as nightlife.

BROCKENHURST

The largest village in the New Forest, set in a very pretty part of the forest with plenty of pubs and a few shops.

WIMBORNE

A great selection of quality shops in this pretty town along with plentiful cafes, pubs and restaurants surrounding a very beautiful church.

BEAULIEU

A small but very beautiful village by the coast in the New Forest with a few gift shops and a lovely garden centre and cafes and a pub.

LYNDHURST

Busy New Forest village with plenty of gift shops and cafes and pubs. Quite touristy in the summer, and the surrounding roads can get very busy, but could be worth a look around at the shops and the Ferrari garage in the high street.

FORDINGBRIDGE MUSEUM

Local history museum located in Fordingbridge high street.

BLASHFORD LAKES NATURE RESERVE

If you fancy a spot of twitching just down the road is this 159 hectare site, particularly spectacular in winter, when huge flocks of over-wintering birds fly onto the lakes to roost. Spring is also a great time to visit when warblers are singing and the daffodils are in bloom.

RHINEFIELD ORNAMENTAL DRIVE, BLACKWATER ARBORERUM & TALL TREES TRAIL

Free to visit, this stunning collection of massive, non-native trees that are a real sight to behold. Several nice walks in the area. Why not pop into Rhinefield House for afternoon tea afterwards?

KNIGHTWOOD OAK

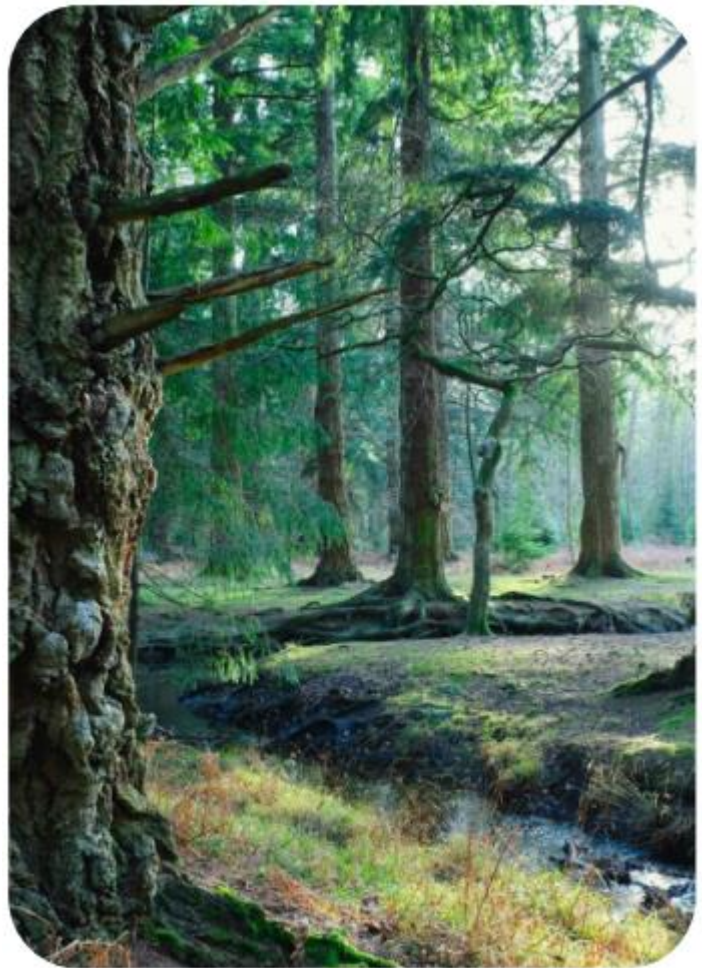
This pedunculate oak is the largest and perhaps the most famous in the New Forest. Over 600 years old, it can be accessed via a nice easy walk.

RUFUS STONE

This stone, close to the A31, is claimed to mark the spot where William II fell after an arrow deflected off a tree.

ROCKBORNE ROMAN VILLA MUSEUM

A unique archaeological site and museum. Walk amongst the remains of the largest known villa complex in the area. Really fascinating. Bring a picnic or visit the cafe. Open from Spring - Autumn

BEAULIEU

Home of the British National Motor Museum, set in the grounds of a stunning manor house and abbey this is a great place to visit and not just for car enthusiasts. They often have events so worth checking what is on.

STONEHENGE (English Heritage)

One of the great wonders of the world, and the best known prehistoric monument in Europe. Great to combine with a visit to Salisbury or Wilton House.

WILTON HOUSE

A beautiful house with 17th Century interiors and world famous art collection. Closed during Winter months.

LIBERTY'S OWL & REPTILE CENTRE

Located just outside of Ringwood, a great place to see some beautiful animals up close.

FISHING

Local lakes provide bountiful opportunities for fishing in nearby Poulner, Blashford and Ibsley.

BOLDERWOOD DEER SANCTUARY

If you haven't seen enough of the local deer, this is a great spot from which to see more from a purpose built viewing platform.

OPEN TOP BUS TOUR

Runs July - September, Open top safari with grandstand views of the scenery, animals and villages of the New Forest.

NEW FOREST WATER PARK

Less than two miles away, they have a cable wakeboard system, aqua park, kayak, paddle boarding and more. Closed in Winter months.

HENGISBURY HEAD, MUDEFORD BEACH Take a walk from the car park along a footpath besides the harbour until you reach Mudeford Beach where the most expensive beach huts in the UK can be found. We love walking along the sand and peeking through the doors to see the extravagant renovations! Have a bite to eat at the Beach House, and catch the land train back to the car park.

SALISBURY CATHEDRAL Such an impressive cathedral with its incredibly tall spire. The original Magna Carta can be viewed in the Chapter House. Then perhaps visit Mompesson House or shop and lunch in Salisbury.

MOMPESSON HOUSE (National Trust)

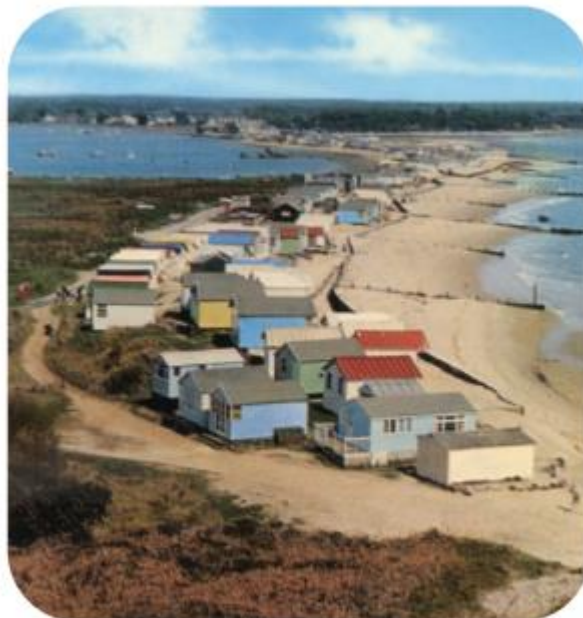
Homely and welcoming 18th Century townhouse in the heart of Salisbury. A great place to visit whilst shopping or lunching in Salisbury.

EXBURY GARDENS

A 200 acre site famous for rhododendrons and rare trees. 12 1/2 inch gauge steam railway also on site.

KINGSTON LACY (National Trust)

A beautiful country house and estate home filled with antiques and painting set in glorious gardens and parkland. Great cafe and shop too

NEW FOREST HERITAGE CENTRE

A free entry museum, gallery and reference library situated in Lyndhurst. Perhaps combine with a wander around the village shops.

DORSET HEAVY HORSE FARM PARK

Conservation centre for over 20 rare breeds of heavy horses.

ANCIENT TECHNOLOGY CENTRE

Educational centre open to the public at specific times through the year, but the best time to visit is for storytelling in the Earthhouse. This 200 seat theatre lit by lamp and fire provides an incredibly atmospheric setting for some tall tales.

SETLEY RIDGE VINEYARD & FARM SHOP

A great pitstop when exploring the south part of the forest. Sample the New Forest wine, and stock up on essentials as well as lovely cakes and snacks, and the garden centre stocks some lovely stuff!

CORFE CASTLE (National Trust) & Swanage

Slightly further afield, Corfe Castle is the most beautiful castle ruin set in a stunning village made with the castle stone. Gift shops and pubs aplenty. It's a real treat to catch the steam train from Corfe to Swanage, a seaside town with seasidey shops and fish & Chips of course.

SANDBANKS & STUDLAND BAY

Visit the famous Sandbanks Peninsular, with beautiful beachfront homes belonging to the rich and famous. Walk on the beach or catch the ferry over to Studland bay with its pristine beaches and sand dunes. A short drive on will take you to Corfe Castle.

BROWNSEA ISLAND (National Trust)

The largest of the islands in Poole Harbour, catch a ferry over and spend the day exploring this unspoiled island free of vehicles. and home to red squirrels, peacocks and other birds. Take a picnic and watch the boats sail by. Enjoy the guided tour on the boat home.

HIGHCLIFFE CASTLE

Grade 1 listed clifftop mansion house. Park outside, visit the house and grounds, stop in the cafe then walk along the beach.

HORSE RIDING

What better way to explore the New Forest than by saddleback! There are several stables offering lessons and hacks. Two close by include Arnis Stables and Fir Tree Farm.
